This Lullaby by Sarah Dessen

Raised by a mother who's had five husbands, eighteen-year-old Remy believes in short-term, no commitment relationships until she meets Dexter, a rock band musician.


If You Come Softly by Jacqueline Woodson


If I Stay by Gayle Forman
