Tracy Van Dyne was officially introduced as the new Director of the Westbury Memorial Public Library at its October 15, 2020, meeting of the Library Board of Trustees. Along with her love of the neighborhood & the community, Tracy brings with her 25 years of experience working in the library world. Her last position was Interim Director of the Great Neck Library.



One of her goals is to bring the Library forward technologically. She will focus on strengthening the infrastructure of the Library by enhancing the IT Department, and getting an outside wireless access point that will allow staff to hold outside programs, and for patrons to access the internet even when the Library is closed.

Tracy is looking forward to meeting the patrons! She shares, "Even during the constraints of the pandemic the Library has been averaging about 70 people a day and curbside pick-up is still very busy. Our patrons have been absolutely wonderful. They feel safe and comfortable."

As the world increasingly moves to virtual and online realities, Tracy has faith that as long as the Library serves as a valued community center and a hub for instruction, career counseling and computer training (in addition to many other valuable services) it will continue to enjoy public support and patronage. With that in mind, Tracy intends to help bring the best of all of those things to the Westbury Community!
