Dr. Dupree-Wilson's most recent peer-reviewed publications include, "Killing "Dixie": The NAACP, the Black Press, and the Crusade to End Black Caricature Culture in Hollywood, 1950–1969" and "Phenotypic Proximity: Colorism and Intraracial Discrimination of Phenotypic Proximity: Colorism and Intraracial Discrimination Among Blacks in the United States and Brazil, 1928-1988." 


CREATING A COMPELLING COLLEGE APPLICATION
