

Earning a BA degree in Communication Arts from New York Institute of Technology and an MS in Library Information Science from Long Island University with a concentration on archival practices, Thom continued producing films, writing and recording music and radio plays.

Beginning in the 1980s Thom served as Production Director for Ray Adell Media Enterprises co-producing the About Long Island series for the Grumman Corporation. He was frequently heard on Long Island radio, has appeared in television commercials, and produced and arranged music for film, television and radio.

Over the past decades, Thom made several appearances on the Joe Franklin Show, and has produced several documentary films including Lenny Cocco & the Chimes - Still in the Mood for Love, Brother Can You Spare a Dollar?, Shinnecock and others.






